### Carol's tip of the day:

#### Keep Your Quilts Square

*To ensure your quilts are 'square', do not sew long border strips onto the sides of your quilt. Instead, measure your quilt down the vertical center, then cut two strips this length. Repeat in the horizontal direction for the top & bottom strips.*

## From Karen's Kitchen Pineapple cake



1-3/4 cup sugar  
2 eggs  
2 cups flour and 2 tsp soda sifted together  
1 No. 2 can crushed pineapple

Beat sugar, eggs – add flour & soda,  
Dump in whole can of pineapple.  
Pour into UNGREASED 9 x 13 pan  
Bake 35 minutes in 350 deg. Oven.

Frosting :

2 - 3oz packages cream cheese  
2 cups powdered sugar  
1 tsp vanilla  
1/2 stick butter or margarine

Beat above and put on when cake is still warm.

*Ask Angela,*

How do you stitch a design out with no changes?

If you have a pattern that you have designed in the software that is already to the correct size and you just want to 'GO,' you can zoom through the scaling process by choosing the same point for the upper right and lower left points during the scaling operation. It goes something like this:

1. Choose the design
2. Move the carriage to the lower left of the block
3. Choose 'Start'
4. Select 2 point scaling, press 'GO' (v2.07)
5. At the 'place on right-upper menu,' press 'GO' (do not move the carriage from the lower left of the block to do this.)
6. Do not move the carriage
7. At the 'place on left-lower menu,' press 'GO'
8. Keep proportion? - Yes
9. QBOT scales the file to 100%
10. Press 'GO' to move the start point

QBOT will move to the start point. Then you can fine tune using the arrow keys. You will get into a rhythm with this method of just pressing the 'GO' button to cycle through the menus. I do it all the time. This saves the time of choosing the area, but remember this only is useful if you know that your 100% scaled block or edge to edge will exactly fit your block or your quilt.
